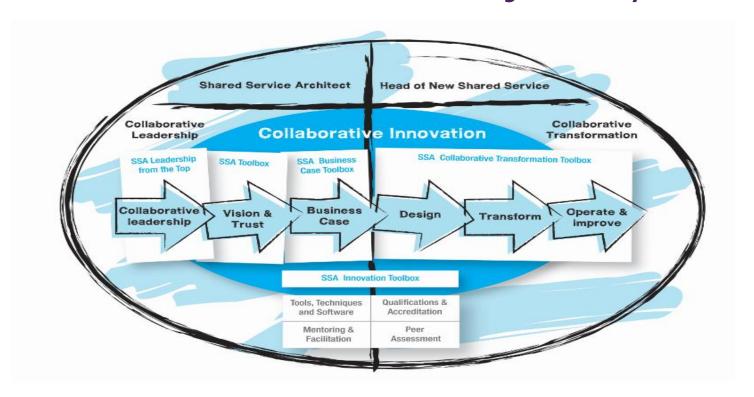

In Collaborations, language is everything...

Example 1: Police, Fire and Social Care work more closely together in a troubled neighbourhood. They count up the saved effort, time and benefits of a pooled budget and work out it saves about £250k per year.

In Collaborations, language is everything...

Example 2: Hampshire County Council sets up a back-office system for the council, police and fire to provide finance, HR and ICT systems.

Example 3: The 10 councils in Manchester create a combined authority to deliver transport, economic growth and health and social care.

Is this <u>a collaboration</u> or <u>a shared service</u>?

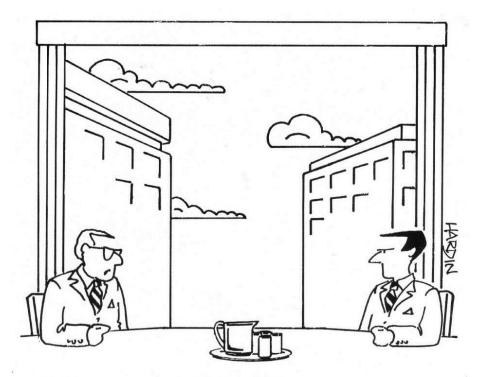

Pitfall 1: The leadership fail to lead collaboratively...

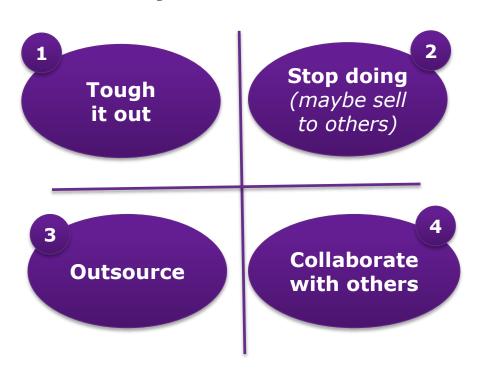


"I'll agree to a fifty-fifty split, But I get the hyphen."

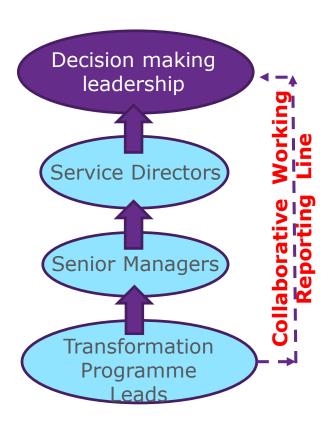
Pitfall 2: Partnership business case drafting



Business Case drafting is:

- under-resourced
- not developed collaboratively
- lacks public sector purpose!

Pitfall 3: Project team skills and authority



Project and programme leads do not have the skills, or the authority to drive their projects forward
