After the long wait for the Procurement Bill to go through the legislative process, the time has finally arrived for public contracting authorities and practitioners to start their implementation of the new Procurement Act 2023 ("PA23"). PA23 heralds the biggest shake-up of procurement rules for a generation and presents plenty of opportunities, challenges as well as new terminology and concepts which need to be quickly understood and applied. This event has been designed to support delegates gain an introductory and practical understanding of the new sections, schedules and published/ available guidance to kickstart successful implementation. The event will also highlight areas which remain the same under PA23 and where day to day application needs to be adapted to avoid costly mistakes and delays to vital procurement projects.
