In 2016 Scotland's politicians and decision makers will gather in Glasgow at what is the biggest and main public sector conference in Scotland. Whether a senior politician, public service manager, finance expert or student, the CIPFA conference for 2016 has been designed to inspire you both personally and professionally. The conference will focus on the leadership skills which will be necessary to ensure that Scotland's route through this age of austerity will be both a confident one. To do that we will unlock entrepreneurial leadership by working with our private sector colleagues. That is why for the duration of the conference the traditional barriers between the public and private sector will be dropped and the spirit of the conference will be to ensure that true collaboration, good practice and innovative thought is recognised.

To enable this the conference format will include a wide choice for delegates to enable a personal conference journey to be selected to meet each delegate's leadership requirements.

Treasurer's Update

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to:

- circulate the draft financial statements for 2015; and
- set out a proposed budget for 2016.

Financial statements 2015

Draft financial statements for 2015 are included at Appendix 1 and have been submitted to CIPFA for consolidation. Claire Gardiner (Grant Thornton) has agreed to provide the independent examination, and this is scheduled to be conducted in March.

The outturn for 2015 is a net deficit of £4,471. This results in a variance of £7,069 against the budgeted net deficit of £11,540, and is mainly attributable to there being no Student Society costs during 2015.

The lower level of income and expenditure in 2015 when compared with 2014 is due to the Treasury Management Forum conference, which was held in 2014 and takes place every two years.

A breakdown of income and expenditure against budget is included in Appendix 2.

A summary of activity will be prepared for the final version of the financial statements for inclusion in the branch annual report.

Draft budget 2016

Appendix 2 sets out the proposed budget for 2016, alongside the budget and actual expenditure for 2015. In particular, the budgets will require to be updated for planned Student Society and Treasury Management Forum activity. For the purposes of this paper, the budgets for 2015 have been carried forward for both groups.

The Executive Committee has recently given further consideration to the potential of wider use of the Archie Gillespie Memorial Fund. The fund currently stands at £10,679 and is used to provide a prize for the top student in local government in Scotland each year. The Committee has expressed an interest in using the fund to support Modern Apprentices, and this could involve the following initiatives:

- providing support where employers may not be able or willing (eg attendance at conferences)
- offering opportunities specifically for Modern Apprentices to get together for networking and developing soft skills
- developing an online portal for learning and development outside of the AAT/CIPFA core curriculum.

Following further discussion with individual committee members, it is clear that there are challenges with each potential initiative. Eg there may be insufficient numbers of Modern Apprentices to deliver a successful event, and an online portal may duplicate resources already available.

Executive Committee members are requested to consider the most appropriate use of the Archie Gillespie Fund so that agreement can be reached on how best to make progress.

Recommendation

The Executive Committee is invited to note the contents of this report and in particular:

- to note the draft financial statements for 2015;
- consider and approve the draft budget for 2016 (subject to updates from the student society and Treasury Management Forum); and
- consider the most appropriate use of the Archie Gillespie Memorial Fund.
